The Wheelchair Foundation is a California based organization that has so far provided hundreds of thousands of free wheel chairs to amputees and others in poor nations of the Americas, Africa and Asia. This wonderful organization arrives in a local city with a truck full of wheel chairs and a list of those who need them. The list is made by local churches and charities. Each person receiving a chair is given it without strings attached.

THESE MEN THEY CALL KNIGHTS

Our council of St Mary with 117 members is a small cog in a mighty machine of Catholic men that exists to serve our Lord Jesus Christ. Our 1.7 million members world wide are the largest lay evangelical organization in the world. With 71,000 knights in Illinois and 8,000 in the Joliet Diocese we are a small company in a huge army of Christian Knights whose purpose is to serve the Lord and each other. We are non-political. Our motto is "In service to One—In service to All".

Knights do not have a distinctive uniform or badge. Many church members are unaware that their church ushers, lectors, Religious Education teachers and other volunteers are often Knights. These quiet Christian men raise money for the poor and handicapped, volunteer labor for worthy projects and raise over 100 Million dollars per year for charity and evangelization. Each local Council is headed by a Grand Knight. The state organization is headed by the state Deputy to the Supreme Knight. The Supreme Knight heads all branches and organizations of the Knights of Columbus

Each Council of the Order has a supervisor called a District Deputy. The District Deputy represents the state organization as inspector and assistant to ensure that the protocols and rules of the order are followed by the officers of the Council. Each Diocese also has a diocesan organization called the Chapter that supervises the Councils for the Bishop. The Joliet Diocese has fifty eight councils in its Chapter. The Chapter organization is headed by a President

A separate order of Knights is the Fourth Degree. Local organizations are called an Assembly and these men, "Sir Knights", wear the distinctive uniforms associated with the Knights of Columbus. The head of each Assembly of the Fourth Degree is the Faithful Navigator. Members of the Councils who have attained fully the Third Degree of the order and who have been a Knight for at least one year may be advanced to the Fourth Degree on a voluntary basis. The State organization of the Fourth Degree is headed by a Master and is separate from the Third Degree organization.




THE CHRISTMAS PARTY


