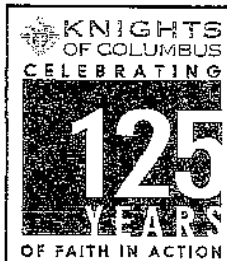

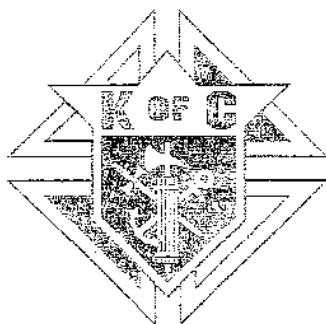

SPECIAL ELECTION

The council presently has no Grand Knight, no Deputy Grand Knight and no Two Year Trustee. Peter Baker and Jim Peppmuller resigned their posts at the end of the January meeting. At the officer meeting in December, the council officers nominated Peter Baker for Grand Knight, Jim Peppmuller for Deputy Grand Knight and Bob Strezo for Trustee. Knights of Columbus rules require that posts must be vacant for thirty days before holding a new election.
