


KNIGHTS SUNDAY

SIDEWALK DEMONSTRATION FOR LIFE

The afternoon of October 5, from 2:30 until 3:30 PM about eighty adults and children from local Christian churches will demonstrate for life in New Lenox. The demonstration consists of standing on the sidewalk on both sides of US 30 starting at Cedar Road, going West. Signs with sayings such as "ABORTION KILLS CHILDREN" and "ABORTION HURTS WOMEN" that are mounted on four foot sticks are held up by each participant. About 120 signs are provided by our Knights of Columbus Council and picked up for reuse next year. Come and join this great way to show our faith to the world. Participants park in the parking lot of the Harris Bank on the corner of US 30 and Cedar Road.



DO YOU EAT BREAKFAST?



THE VOCATIONS RAFFLE

Every year the State Council sponsors a raffle to raise money for vocations. Money raised is distributed to seminarians on the basis of need—seminarians pay their own expenses and are often very poor as a result. Each diocese has a Diocesan Vocations Chairman who works with the Priest in charge of vocations to determine which seminarian should get money. The raffle pays a grand prize of \$10,000 to sweeten the deal. The raffle books cost \$15.00 each. When a book is sold the council that sells it gets to keep \$9.00 of the \$15.00 and then sends in \$6.00 from each book to the State Council. Council 6993 raises over \$300 every year from this raffle. When buying a raffle booklet DO NOT TAKE THE BOOKLET APART AND DO NOT TAKE THE FRONT COVER OFF!!!!

The Supreme Council has a program called RSVP that reimburses councils that donate \$500 to a single seminarian by sending the council a check for \$100.

WHAT IS THE NEWMAN CLUB?





Newman Centers are places of refuge for Catholic students. They minister to their religious needs and provide a place to meet and be supported by their fellow Catholics. The centers provide social and religious activities, retreats and general fellowship in support of our young collegians.

On September 30 the State Council will mail contribution requests to every Knight in Illinois. As part of our duty to evangelize, it is important that each Knight give serious thought to being generous in donating to this worthy cause. 

